

1 MR. HURLEY: Out of turn. No, it is not out
2 of turn.

3 THE CLERK: Entered as Defendant's Exhibit
4 No. 5.

5 MR. HURLEY: Thank you.

6 Stipulation of Fact.

7 The parties hereby stipulate that the
8 following passages are part of the records maintained
9 by Toni Ballis-Rowe, who provided counseling services
10 to Anna Morse from April of 2008 through March of
11 2009.

12 April 28th, 2008, Initial Outpatient
13 Assessment. Parents having difficulty figuring out
14 if behavior is attention-seeking and part of past
15 abuse. Six-year-old brought in by father. It's
16 sufficient that she's having problems and her family,
17 especially her father, says she "talks too much".

18 Father explains that she does not express
19 her feelings and shows angry behavior. Anna says
20 that her stomach aches and so many somatic
21 complaints. Anna comes to treatment because of
22 sexual and emotional and physical abuse by her
23 stepsister.

1 May 12th, 2008: Three weeks later.

2 Completed initial assessment with patient and
3 parents. Father especially insistent that Anna's
4 sessions be confidential.

5 December 4th, 2008: Met with father who
6 reports that Anna told the school that her father
7 slapped her and they were investigated.

8 Interview with Anna: She did continue to
9 report that her father slapped her. She thought it
10 was because she was crying about her mother. She did
11 not show emotion. When asked if she was afraid of
12 her father, she said "no".

13 When asked if she felt safe at home, she
14 said, "yes". She did not have any marks.

15 December 18th, 2008, Family Session:
16 Addressed Anna's accusations about her father
17 slapping her in the presence of her parents. Anna
18 did recant, saying her sister Ashley's beliefs are in
19 her head.

20 With regard to the last two entries, the
21 parties agree that Melvin Morse was not present
22 during the December 4th, 2008 interview between Anna
23 Morse and Toni Ballas-Rowe. Melvin Morse was present
